Notes:

1. This report is based on enrollment data as reported to the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education. Each semester's enrollment is based on a census date, which is the last day to add a class (the eighth calendar day of the semester).
2. This report is based on the standard cohort of entering first-time students defined by the US Department of Education. This report includes full-time bachelor's degree-seeking and undeclared students. Part-time, associate degree-seeking, non-degree, and transfer students are excluded. Two specific groups of students who are not actually "first-time" are included in the cohort: students who took college courses while still in high school and students who took college courses during the summer semester directly before the fall semester being reported.
3. Students are counted as retained if they were enrolled as of the fall 2008 census date, regardless of their full- or part-time status or academic program as of that semester.
